

Valley

In Valley Class we have been learning to answer the questions 'Who celebrates Lunar New Year?" and "What might we see at a Lunar New Year celebration?'. As we learnt about Lunar New Year the children created shadow puppets to use when retelling the story of great race between the animals of the Zodiac. We also created folded paper dragons and paper lanterns to decorate our classrooms and enjoyed watching and recreating our dragon dances.

The children have also been learning to answer the question 'How can we tell if it is living or non-living?' as we learnt that animals are living things that grow, move and breathe. The children created some wonderful models of living animals as they identified features such as eyes,



Woodland

Woodland Class have been busy in science this week conducting a simple experiment to learn which materials are absorbent and which are waterproof. We have been learning to choose the correct materials for the task, and we learnt more about this when learning to join materials to create swings and seesaws for a playground. We have learnt to use pipe cleaners and straws to create a stable base for playground equipment.



River

In River Class this half term we are learning all about farm animals and life cycles! We will be using books and art to explore life on the farm, and the life cycles of different animals and bugs. We will be using positional and directional language during outdoor walks and will also be looking at different types of bird eggs.

This first week we have been exploring different textures and mediums for creating pictures.



Moorland

Moorland Class have starting learning about the first explorers to reach the South Pole. They have been using the same skills as historians and looking for evidence in photographs to find out about Captain Scott's journey.

The children have also been creating story maps of the Lonely Beast's journey to find a friend in our new class book and did some amazing drama to act out the places he visited!
