To protect children who have allergies to nuts while also helping them as they grow to take responsibility for what foods they can safely eat and to be aware of what foods may put them at risk. We do not allow nuts or nut products in school lunch boxes. This includes:

- Packs of nuts
- Peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- Pesto which contains nuts
- Cakes made with nuts
- Any home-cooked meals for packed lunches that are made from nuts
- Any shared food for after-school events with nuts or nut oils

Thank you for your help and support to ensure that we keep all of our pupils safe.

We did get rather soggy in the rain but nobody complained and our classroom is still very warm so we all dried out (steamed dry) in the afternoon!



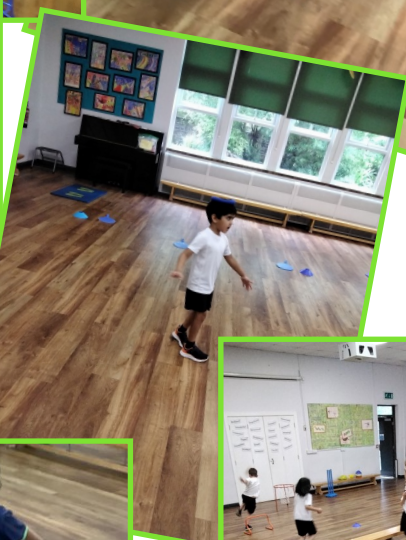
Moorland
